
Criteria for Certification as an Anthroposophic Physician (International Core Curriculum)

- 1. The basic condition for certification as an Anthroposophic physician is to have completed medical training (registration).
- 2. Participation in five 7-day IPMT modules (of 50 hours each).
- 3. At least two years' work with a mentor (averaging 2.5 hours a week).
- 4. Study of least two basic anthroposophic texts alone or in a small group.
- 5. Submission of three documented case histories showing the patient's medical history, diagnosis and therapy.
- 6. Submission of a project showing the trainee's ability to independently work with the fundamental elements of Anthroposophic Medicine.



7. An oral examination showing trainee's ability to independently work with the fundamental elements of Anthroposophic Medicine.

Trainees who started their training before October 1, 2018, are only required to submit two case histories and no project.
